

'The laws of British era will change' Piyush Narsikar wins title

Nagpur 17 August: Despite the Indian Constitution coming into force after independence, the criminal justice system was governed by two centuries old laws of the British era. Legal experts and the intellectual class of the country were considering them as a symbol of colonial slavery and the loopholes of these laws have also been continuously exposed. The Modi government at the Center has now decided to abolish the laws of the British era. On the last day of the Monsoon session, Home Minister Amit Shah introduced bills to amend three 163-year-old fundamental laws in the Lok Sabha. The biggest

change will be regarding the sedition law, which will be brought in the form of a new law. Indian Penal Code made in 1860 will now be replaced by Indian Judicial Code 2023, CrPC made in 1898 by Indian Civil Protection Code and Indian Evidence Code made in 1872 by Indian Evidence Code Bill. At present, all these three bills have now been sent to the parliamentary committee for review. Sedition law has been the most discussed in the direction of abolishing old laws. Due to the amount of misuse of this law, the demand to abolish it was being made for a long time. There is no doubt that this law has mostly been used against political opponents. From 2012 till now 13000 people have been arrested under this law. When the matter reached the Supreme Court, it stayed its use until the provisions of the sedition law were reconsidered. After this decision, the government

considered it. Famous personalities of the country, journalists, cartoonists, environmentalists and some student leaders were also victims of this law. Now the word treason will be used instead of treason. Now, under Section 150, if any act against the nation is done by spoken or written or by sign or picture or electronic means, then punishment from seven years to life imprisonment will be possible. Threatening the unity and sovereignty of the country would be a crime. Currently, under Section 124A of the IPC, sedition is punishable with imprisonment of three years to life. It remains to be seen how the apprehension of misuse of new laws is eliminated. It is not good for democracy to keep innocent people in jail without appeal, argument or lawyer. In the past too, laws like POTA and UAPA have been misused. These laws are the foundation of the prosecution process for crimes in India. Which act is a crime and what should

be the punishment for it is decided under the Indian Penal Code. The method of arrest, investigation and trial is written in the Code of Criminal Procedure. The Indian Evidence Act lays down how the facts of a case are to be proved, how statements are to be recorded and on whom is the burden of proof. The Home Minister says that these laws are a legacy of colonialism and will be adapted to today's situation. The good thing is that the punishments have been tightened for many crimes. For example, in the case of gang rape, the punishment has been increased from 10 years to 20 years. Provision for death penalty has been made for mob lynching and rape of a minor. Strict action will also be taken against those who have sex by changing the name. For the first time, community service is being included as a punishment. For minor offences, the punishment can be imprisonment of 24 hours or a fine of Rs 1000 or community service. There is such a law in America and Britain as well. Time limit is also being fixed for the

hearing of the cases. Electronic information has now been included in the Evidence Act. Along with this, witnesses, victims and accused will now be able to appear in all courts electronically. With the changes, from filing of charge sheet till cross-examination will be possible online only. In the new bill, the timeline for the use of forensics and trial of the case has also been fixed. For example, after the completion of arguments in a case in the Sessions Court, judgment has to be given within thirty days. This deadline can be extended up to 60 days. The parliamentary committee will consider these bills and the opposition included in the committee will give its opinion on it. It is possible that opposition will emerge on the drafts of the bill. That's why it is necessary that all the work should be done in a transparent manner. Some people are calling the proposed laws a new cover on the old file. It has to be kept in mind that the guilty are punished but the innocent are not punished.

Rohan Gourabathni of Telangana, Shubham Kumar of Bihar, Yash Kulkarni of Rajasthan, Ravi Palsule of Madhya Pradesh and Sanjeev Sood of Punjab scored 7.5 points and were placed 3rd to 8th position respectively based on their tie break score. The Prizes were distributed at the hands of Shri Surendra Agnihotri, Assistant Commissioner Central GST Nagpur who is also an ardent Bird Lover and Bird Photographer. Dr. Mrunalini Borkar, Associate Professor, IGMC and Hon. Secretary of Surgeons Association of Nagpur was the Guest of Honour. Ex. MLC and Vice President MCA Shri Girish Vyasa who was the Chairman of Organising Committee of the event Presided Over the Prize Distribution Function. Most dams in Nagpur region have less water stock than last year



Nagpur 17 August: Absence of monsoon rains in the first half of the month of August has reduced the water storage in all major dams of Nagpur region as compared to the corresponding figures in the previous year. Nagpur region had 75.20 percent water storage last year on this date, whereas this year so far the water storage in the region was around 67.30 percent. The total designed storage of all 16 major dams of Nagpur region is 4,302.42 Million cubic metre whereas on August 14, the total live storage of these dams were 3,170.06 Million cubic metre. Nagpur district, which has five major dams, has less water storage as compared to previous year. Totaldoh dam, which is the major source of water for the district, has 79.11 per cent of water stock and last year it had 92.42 percent water. Today, the live water stock in Totladoh dam has 954.49 Million cubic metre water out of 1166.93 Million cubic metre of its designed storage capacity. Similarly, Kamptee Khairi dam also provides water to Nagpur city and it

has 93.80 percent water stock on Monday and last year it had 98.12 per cent of water stock. Kamptee Khairi has 172.18 Million cubic metre live storage till August 14 and the designed storage of this dam is 180.98 Million cubic metre. Other dams like Khindsi, Nand and Wadgaon of Nagpur district also have less water storage as compared to previous year. In Nagpur region, out of 16 major dams, only three dams including Gosikhurd, Dhapewada, and Bor have more water storage this year as compared to previous year. Gosikhurd dam is another major dam of Nagpur region after Totladoh, which has more water with 45.10 percent stock this year as compared to 27.33 per cent of last year. The total designed storage of Gosikhurd dam is 1,146.08 Million cubic metre and it has 739.74 Million cubic metre water stock till Monday. Despite less water storage in Nagpur region than last year, the dams are capable of catering to the water demand of Nagpur region for the next 2 years even after less monsoon rains.

Foul play? Amid the second tender process, Kalmeshwar Municipal Council floats third tender call!!

Nagpur 17 August: The 'Rs 50 Crore Amrut Water Supply Scheme Tender' continues to be intriguing due to the involvement of officials from Kalmeshwar-Bramhani Municipal Council and Maharashtra Jeevan Pradhikaran. While the process of the second tender is ongoing, the Kalmeshwar-Bramhani Municipal Council has floated a third tender call for the same project, raising objections. While officials support the third tender call, stating that only one candidate remains after disqualifying the other two due to the same proprietorship, government officials seem to have intentionally overlooked the fourth applicant! According to available details, the Kalmeshwar-Bramhani Municipal Council floated a tender for an approximately Rs 50 crore water supply scheme in the first week of May 2023. Initially, six firms submitted bids for the tender. However, after technical evaluation, three firms were removed from the list, leaving only three firms—Laxmi Engineering, Swastik Construction (both from Kolhapur), and Central India. In due course, M/s Samrudhi Infra

Projects challenged their disqualification in the High Court. Following this, the HC reinstated them in the tender race. An order to cancel the tender call was issued to Maharashtra Jeevan Pradhikaran (MJP) and Kalmeshwar-Bramhani Municipal Council on June 17, citing the reason for disqualification as the same ownership in two companies bidding for the same tender.
