## Job fraud: Man duped of Rs 10 lakh, five persons booked by Sitabuldi cops

**Nagpur 14 April:** Sitabuldi Police have booked five persons, including three members of a family, for defrauding a senior citizen to the tune of Rs 10.01 lakh on the pretext of providing a job to his son at Bokaro Steel Plant in Jharkhand. The accused have been identified as Nishikant Ramdas Ragatpure, his wife Vaishnavi and brother Tapeswar, all residents of Plot No 24, Chandramani Nagar, Ajesh Shashikumar Pillai, a resident of Katangikala, Ward No 05, Gondia and Vivek Shyamrao Kappate, a resident of Balaji Nagar, Navegaon Bandh, district Gondia. Govind Laxman Choudhary (61), a resident of Plot No 359 Koshtipura, Sitabuldi, was a friend of accused Nishikant's father Ramdas Ragatpure. Nishikant, Vaishnavi and Tapeswar promised a job to Govind Choudhary's son Anup at Bokaro Steel Plant. They took Rs 10.01 lakh from Govind Choudhary on the pretext of providing the job to Anup between October 25, 2018 and April 05, 2023. In connivance with accused Ajesh Pillai and Vivek Kappate, they prepared fake appointment letter and sent it to Anup. Following a complaint lodged by Govind Choudhary, police registered a case under Sections 420, 465, 468, 471 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code against all the accused persons. Further investigations are on.

## Schools threaten to recover RTE dues from parents, stop admissions

**Nagpur 14 April:** Private English schools across Maharashtra have refused to admit students under Right To Education (RTE) Act as the State Government has not reimbursed Rs 1,800 crore against the fees of the students admitted under RTE for the past six years. Maharashtra English School Trustees Association (MESTA) has threatened to recover the money from the students admitted under RTE if the Government did not pay the pending amount. MESTA members said they were afraid that the burden of the arrears, which have been accumulating for the past six years under RTE admissions, would now fall on the parents of the students admitted under RTE. The Association's stand may deprive students of the right to education. The Government has reserved 25 percent seats for children under the Right to Education (RTE) Act. These children are admitted to private English schools for free and their fees are paid by the Government. However, reimbursements since 2017-18 have been pending with the State Government. Of the total amount pending, the Government has so far released only around Rs 200 crore, reports said, adding that some schools had been awaiting the amounts since 2012. In the last Assembly Session, the State Government had filed an official reply on this issue, admitting that Rs 707.49 crore from 2012-13 to 2021-22, was pending with it. For the academic year 2022-23, the Government set aside Rs 200 crore, of which Rs 84 crore were disbursed. School organisations do not agree with the Government statistics. They say that the pending reimbursement amount is much more. Dr Sanjay Tayade Patil, Founder President of MESTA said, "We are ready to face action, but we will not give admissions under RTE now. 18,000 schools in the State are members of our association. In 2017, the Government gave only 50 percent of the amount. After that, the amount was reduced to 15 to 17 percent, and then only 7-8 percent was given. During the coronavirus pandemic period, the amount was reduced to Rs 8,000 per student, from Rs 17, 676. After the pandemic, the original amount was restored, but the Government did not reimburse any of it." Despite a decrease in the amount, the Government failed to make most of the disbursements. Due to non-receipt of dues for a long time, some schools are now on the verge of closure.

## RTO cracks down on drivers for no seatbelt

**Nagpur 14 April:** Cracking the whip, the Nagpur Regional Transport Office (RTO) has started suspending the licenses of drivers for violating the seatbelt rule, confirmed Transport Department officials. According to Assistant RTO Harshal Dake, most violators had their driving license suspended after they were caught for repeat offenses. The traffic police send a list of violators to the RTO every month for suspension of driving licenses. Besides this, the RTO also suspends licenses of traffic violators. Dake mentioned that these violators generally lead to road accidents, and to prevent accidents, their licenses are being suspended. The department has begun suspending driving licenses of violators for not less than three months under Section 19 of the MVA, 1988, read with Rule 21 of the Central MV Rules, 1989. The violations include driving at a speed exceeding the specified limit, jumping red lights, using mobiles while driving, etc. The decision to suspend driving licenses has been taken in view of the increase in road accidents. In the first quarter of this calendar year, the City and East offices of the Transport Department have suspended the driving licenses of 13 drivers/riders for speeding, 32 for signal jumping, 203 for using mobile phones while driving, and 567 two-wheeler riders for riding without helmets. In 2022, both the City and East RTOs had suspended driving licenses of 11,672 motorists based on recommendations from the traffic police. In 2021, as many as 7,474 drivers faced suspension of their driving licenses, and in 2020, a total of 9,315 drivers had their licenses suspended when the city was under Covid-induced lockdown. The RTO's strict stance on seatbelt violations and other traffic offenses serves as a reminder for all drivers to follow traffic rules and regulations to prevent road accidents.
